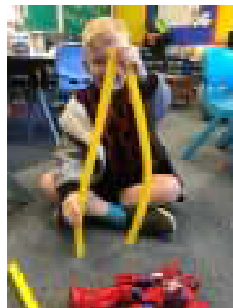
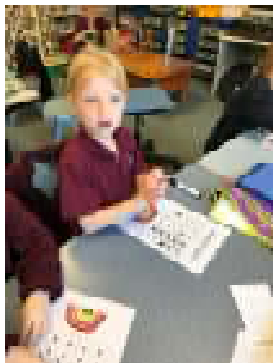
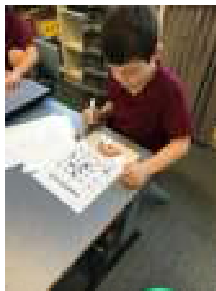
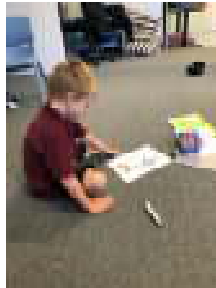
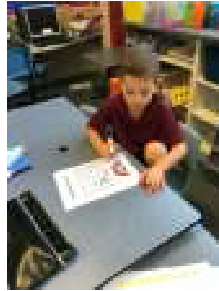
Week 6 Term 2

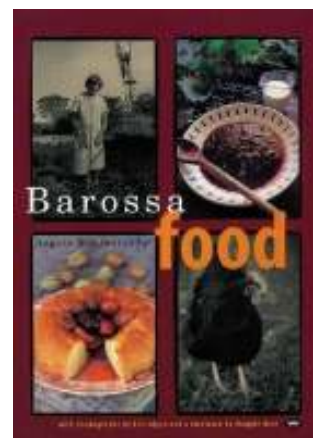
